

Will of Elijah Wynn, Deceased

Know all men by these presents: that I E. Wynn of Eclectic, Elmore Co Ala., being of sound mind and desiring to leave instructions as to the disposition and division of my property after my death among my legal heirs in succession as seems to be right and just to all parties concerned do hereby proclaim and acknowledge the following instructions to be my last will and testament ~ ~ ~ ~ ~

--- First: -- I desire the income from my farm and other property to be shared equally by my wife and my three younger children until the youngest comes of age, and I herein instruct the executor whom I shall hereinafter name to appropriate such of the above named incomes as may be necessary to the end that my three younger children above named may have ordinary school advantages. When the younger of these children comes of legal age I would then have all my children by my second wife to share equally in common with my present wife all revenues from property over and above expenses. As long as my wife shall live I wish her to occupy my present house as hers, or at least so long as she may desire to do so; and at her death I desire all of the then existing estate to be equally divided between all the children by my second wife. I make no provision herein for my two children by my 1st wife towit Axium Wynn and Mary Baker, because I consider that in the past they have already received from me fully their just and equitable share of my estate. To my son Charles Wynn I give and bequeath as his full share of my real estate the forty lying on the other side of the creek west of my house towit NE 1/4 of NE 1/4 of Sec 28 T19 R20. In order that these my last instructions may be faithfully and honestly carried out I hereby name my son Charlie Wynn as my executor and having every confidence in his honesty and integrity of purpose I herein respectively {sic} request the Court of Probate not to put him to the trouble and inconvenience of making bond. For any trouble or expense he may be at in carrying out the provisions of this my Will I would have him retain a reasonable compensation for such services

and expense if he so
